EXAMPLE ANSWER:

Archaeology is a very valuable discipline that guides and informs our understanding of past civilisations. Not only does archaeology play a significant role in uncovering culturally significant artefacts and data, but it also tells us a lot about the earth and its natural history. Excavating different soils and dirt leads to discovery of minerals that are often unique and also help add to the story of what took place in that area hundreds or thousands of years before.

Although the Indiana Jones movies portray archaeology as being very adventurous and even dangerous, this is not the case. Archaeologists are academics who respect the law and want to learn about how past civilisations worked. They are not treasure hunters.

People who want to get involved in archaeology can research different digs online. Although volunteers are usually asked to pay for the experience, if an individual continues to volunteer they may be offered the opportunity of supervising an excavation in the future.

As well as creating connections with other individuals who are interested in archaeology, individuals can also seek archaeology opportunities through university degrees.




